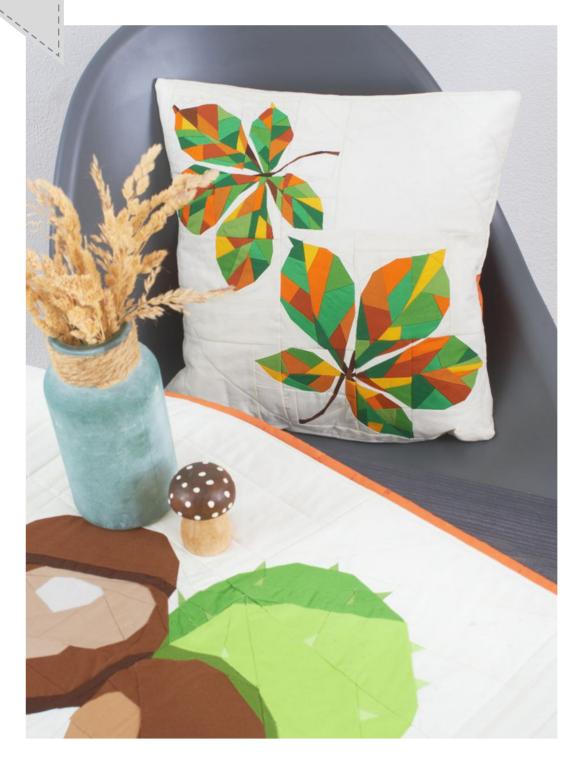


Kissen



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Material:

- Top in 16.5" x 16.5"
- Backing fabric 60cm
- Thread to match the background fabric
- Batting (cotton batting 80/20 recommended) in 18" x 18"
- A pillow inlay (35 cm x 35 cm)

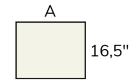
Sewing:

STEP 1 (OPTIONAL BUT HIGHLY RECOMMENDED)

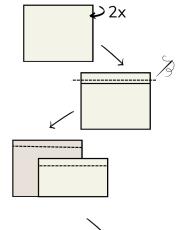
- Make a quilt sandwich using the top, the batting, and a 20" x 20" square of your backing fabric, and quilt it.
- Cut the batting and backing fabric to the size of your top.

STEP 2 - SEWING THE CUSHION

Cut two rectangles with the following dimensions:



- Fold edge A on both pieces 1" inwards and iron it.
- Fold the same edge another 1" inwards, iron it, and stitch it neatly.



- Now place the two pieces right sides together on top of the chestnut piece – make sure that the larger piece is on top of the smaller piece.
- Pin the pieces together and sew around the outside with a 0.25" seam allowance.
- Turn your pillowcase inside out, iron the edges smooth again, and insert the pillow insert.
